⁵In the days of Herod, king of Judea, there was a certain priest named Zechariah, who belonged to the priestly division of Abijah. His wife was from the daughters of Aaron, and her name was Elizabeth. ⁶They were both righteous before God, walking blamelessly in all the commandments and righteous decrees of the Lord. ⁷They did not have a child because Elizabeth was unable to bear children, and they were both

well along in years. ⁸On one occasion, while Zechariah was serving as priest before God and his division was on duty, ⁹he was chosen by lot, according to the custom of the priesthood, to go into the temple of the Lord and burn incense. ¹⁰The whole crowd of people were praying outside the temple during the hour of the incense offering.

- C: Give peace to the nations and preserve those who suffer the threat of persecution and death for Your sake.
- P: Be with those who cry to You in any need. Grant to them grace sufficient to preserve them in the day of trouble, and provide for them, according to Your will, healing and comfort for all their needs of body and soul. We pray to You especially on behalf of _____ and those we name in our hearts.

- P: As our families gather in this holy season of our Savior's birth, give to us patience that we may be slow to judge and quick to forgive. Give to the lonely the comfort of Your presence and help us to extend to them the welcome of our homes and the friendship of Your grace. Make us mindful of those less fortunate, who celebrate this blessed feast in poverty and want.
- C: Teach us to be generous in the care of those in need and to cheerfully return to You the tithes and offerings of a grateful heart. Accept with these offerings the living sacrifice of our bodies to Your service and our voices in praise and thanksgiving.
